NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell went out of his way to thank our city when he said, "I don't believe that you could have a team of people who were better prepared, more excited, more enthusiastic, and frankly could not have done a better job. It was just an extraordinary effort, incredible effort. They set a new bar,"

Wow, we set a new bar. And not only the NFL, but fans and celebrities alike gave our city top marks. Doesn't that make you feel proud? Seems like a job very well done. Some of the interesting numbers from the <u>visithouston.com</u> website show that we had:

- 10,000 Volunteers on hand to help execute the event.
- 140,000 Out-of-town visitors.
- 1 million People estimated to have attended some component of the Super Bowl experience over a 10-day period.
- 350 million Net economic impact in dollars on Houston.
- 84,000 Hotel rooms in the Houston area, up from around 44,000 in 2004, the last time Houston hosted the game.
- 4 million Approximate amount going to nonprofits in the region through the NFL's Charitable Giving Program.
- 97,000 Square footage of the new pedestrian promenade in front of the George R. Brown Convention Center that with Discovery Green is part of a broader district called Avenida Houston—now in place for residents to enjoy.

It's nice to take a break sometime from buzzing and enjoy a little peace and serenity, but let's gear it up again for the March 7th TPG breakfast when we all meet to enjoy fellow members, guests and our speaker, Lisa Trapani Shumate, Vice President & General Manager of Houston Public Media. 


